At Eversley, we are lucky enough to have two wildlife attracting ponds. During our forest school sessions, we study the nature within and around the pond. This gives us a useful insight into the health of the wildlife and ways in which we can help them to thrive in their habitats. Keeping our ponds clean means that the eco system can flourish.
