Elements of art

Form Line Pattern

Key Vocabulary	
Charcoal	A drawing material made from burnt wood
Cross-hatching	Drawing lines crossed over and close together
Contertina	Folding something backwards ad forward so it becomes smaller but can be stretched out again
Expression	The look on a face caused by how someone is feeling
Stippling	Making quick up and down hand movements to make dash and dot marks on paper
Illustrations	Showing a story using pictures
Illustrator	Someone who draws illustrations often in books

Key Knowledge

Form: That 'composition' means how things are arranged on the page.

Line: Lines can be used to fill shapes, to make outlines and to add detail or pattern.


Pattern: Drawing techniques such as hatching, scribbling, stippling, and blending can make patterns.

Artists


Quentin Blake
